# HOUSE BY THE SIDE OF THE ROAD

House By the Side of the Road has served our neighbors since 1970, founded by local churches, including First Presbyterian, and the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners. Entirely volunteer-run, every dollar donated keeps its doors open. House provides FREE clothing and small household items in a welcoming, retail-like space.

Each fall, Presbyterian Women support the "Undercover Operation," which this year donated 561 women's underwear and 142 children's garments, valued at over \$2,030. Many also donated gently used clothing and household items year-round.


# FELLOWSHIP OF THE LEAST COIN


